**GOSPEL LESSON: Luke 2:1-14**

P. The Holy Gospel according the St. Luke.

**C. Glory to you, O Lord.**

P. In those days a decree went out from the Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven,  
and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

### **SERMON**

Dear disciples: Grace and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus.  
Amen.

Merry Christmas!

The Lord is here, Jesus was born in Bethlehem, the promises of God have been fulfilled. Our Savior is here!

*Titus sums it up: "God has appeared" to train us to "renounce impiety and worldly passions" and "to live lives that are self-controlled" (2:11-12). Christmas Eve calls us to shift our sights, reset our patterns, remember what joy this mysterious, miraculous, renewing vision brings—a world in which God's mercy offers to everyone the feeling of awe every day.<sup>1</sup>*

I read a Christmas story the other day, and like many Christmas stories, the title is "A Christmas Miracle," and focuses on the importance of giving. In this tale, a young girl, Rose, dreams of a Christmas morning filled with extravagant gifts. It's a dream that has no chance of coming true, because her family is poor. Ultimately, though, Rose's family's act of kindness to a stranger produces a Christmas miracle. In the story Rose searched the sky. She needed to find a shooting star. Christmas was only three days away, and she had to make a wish. After breakfast, she helped her mother wash dishes. "Mama," she said. "If you could have anything for Christmas, anything at all, what would you wish for?" Mama smiled and set the clean plates in the cupboard. "I already have everything I could want -- you, your brothers and sisters, and your father, all in good health."

"I know, but I mean something extra," Rose said, as she squeezed out the dish towel. "Something wrapped in a box that you could open on Christmas morning. What would it be?"

"Well, it would be a mighty funny-looking box," said Mama. "But if I could have something extra, I'd wish for a Christmas tree, tall and full, with so many decorations you could hardly see the branches. And a big, plump turkey I could roast with dressing and potatoes." She leaned against the cupboard and smiled. "And when it was done, we would sit down at the table next to our Christmas tree, and eat the finest Christmas dinner any of us has ever tasted." She closed her eyes. "I can almost taste it now."

"And a new dress?" asked Rose. "Would you like a new dress?"

"Yes," Mama nodded. "A new dress."

Surprisingly that Christmas Eve, a stranger stood on the step. His eyelids sagged with weariness. The stranger's voice quivered. "Could you shelter a hungry traveler from the cold?" "Of course," they said and opened the door for the stranger. "You're just in time for dinner. We don't have much, but you are welcome to share what we have." "Bless you," said the stranger. "Merry Christmas."

Before Rose closed her eyes, she took one more look out the window. A bright yellow star shot across the sky, leaving a sparkling trail behind it. "Oh!" she cried. Rose stared at the shooting star.

"Please let my family have a wonderful Christmas," she whispered, "and let Mama have a Christmas tree."

Dawn peeked over the mountain. Rose opened her eyes. It was Christmas! She would surprise her parents and the traveling stranger by making the coffee before anyone else awoke.

She tiptoed toward the fire. Everybody was sleeping, and the stranger was gone! On the floor where he had slept lay a bulging gunnysack remains.

"Mama! Papa!" Rose shouted. "Look."



Her parents rushed over, they all stared at the sack.

"It's filled with presents," Papa said. He pulled out a box and read the tag. "This one's for you, and this one's for Mama."

Mama lifted a green lace dress from her box, and Papa opened a shiny, new pipe. Rose watched in silence. She was happy for her family. Still, the sack was empty, and there was no gift for her. She ran to the window to hide her tears.

"Oh!" she cried. "Look!"

Outside stood a fir tree, full and tall, with beautiful hand-carved decorations.

Rose ran out the door. On the tree was a note that said: "To Rose. Merry Christmas." "It's a miracle!" she shouted. "My wish came true. Merry Christmas!"<sup>2</sup>

What is wonderful in this Christmas Story is that Rose, the main character, is happy only when she sees that the dreamed Christmas tree for her mother was there. Her present was not for her, it was for her mother, but for Rose the real present was that someone she loved received a beautiful present.

The story teaches us to find joy and happiness bringing joy and happiness to others and wishing others to see their dreams realized. This is exactly what the spirit of Christmas is. God's joy and happiness is to contemplate our dreams and our joy realized.

That is what the apostle writes to Titus: *<sup>11</sup>The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all.* The grace is this surprising act of mercy that appeared mysteriously as the stranger in our Christmas Story and disappeared leaving us a sack full of presents making our dreams real.

This evening we celebrate that <sup>11</sup>*The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all.* To all, not just to some, but to all, because the gift of Jesus is a universal gift that comes to bless everybody, but we need to trust, we need to have faith in the miracle of God. We need to recognize God in the presence of the stranger, in the visit of the needy, in the conversation with the pilgrim. We all are pilgrims, we all need to gather and pray for each other, we need to recognize Christ presence in each other and welcome that presence to celebrate together that <sup>11</sup>*The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all.*

The gift of God that we receive in Jesus Christ redeems us and creates in us a passion to share the gift with others. The gift of God this evening appeared wrapped in bands of cloth and laid in a manger in Bethlehem. The gift comes to enliven us, enrich us, transform us and bless us with abundant joy and gratitude.

God comes to our world to open to us the doors of a new future expressed in new meanings and new opportunities to be better. For that reason, the letter to Titus after proclaiming our salvation states that the goal of this salvation is at the present time: <sup>12</sup>*training us to renounce impiety and worldly passions, and in the present age to live lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly.*

Christmas is not only carols, lights and decorated trees, Christmas is the opportunity to decorate also our life, illuminate our heart and sing a song of permanent joy in gratitude for the gift of Jesus Christ.

Every year we decorate our homes to remember this holy night, we sing the Christmas songs, we light our Christmas tree, we share a Christmas dinner, but the most important decoration, enlightening and transformation should not stay only for the twelve days of Christmas but should be a permanent experience of a renovated and transformed heart that is now the manger for baby Jesus. Yes, it

is our heart the manger, it is our life that needs to be decorated with the Christmas spirit permanently, and it is our life the inn where the son of God wants to come and incarnate daily to bring God news to the people.

We are invited to think beyond ourselves and imagine that the shepherds and the wisemen are coming looking for the son of God in a manger. But the manger is your heart now, and the son of God wants that you open your heart to your neighbor, to your family, to your parents, siblings, children, and everybody, because all are invited to contemplate the mystery that is now incarnated and present in the hearts of all the ones that are proclaiming that Jesus was born to bring salvation to all.

But you can think that this is too difficult. It is very difficult to try to live in a way that Christ can be present and visible in us 24/7. I know it is hard and I know it is difficult, but we are not alone. We have the presence of the Holy Spirit, we have the community of faith: the church, which supports us and helps us. We have our family, we have the Bible, we have the possibility to pray, we have the opportunity to serve, we have from God many doors that are always open to explore new and better ways to live our Christian faith in very meaningful ways.

Yes, this will be always a work in progress but the life of discipleship, the baptismal life is always a work in progress. It is always God making us new every morning and forgiving us every evening. Yes, our Christian life is always a work in progress – and this is exactly what Christmas is too. It is the work of God that began in a manger, but continues to develop in a ministry that has a Good Friday followed by an Easter morning, and that now is inspiring us and helping us to remember that the great adventure, the great journey began in a manger, in a small town with a baby where the mystery of God was revealed in simplicity, vulnerability and amazing love to the simple, the humble, the poor,

the needy and the brokenhearted. The same God that incarnated in the child of Bethlehem is now incarnating in your heart as a great transformative presence that wants you to experience the same awe and wonder that two thousand years ago the common people of Judah experienced.

It is Christmas time, and this is the night that reminds us that life begins small and simple, and salvation is like that: small, simple but growing, developing, expanding and transforming. It is a gift for all. It is for you and for the whole world.

This holy night your heart is the manger for Jesus, and Jesus wants to bless you and help you to be his witness the rest of your life. Enjoy the journey with the child of Bethlehem.

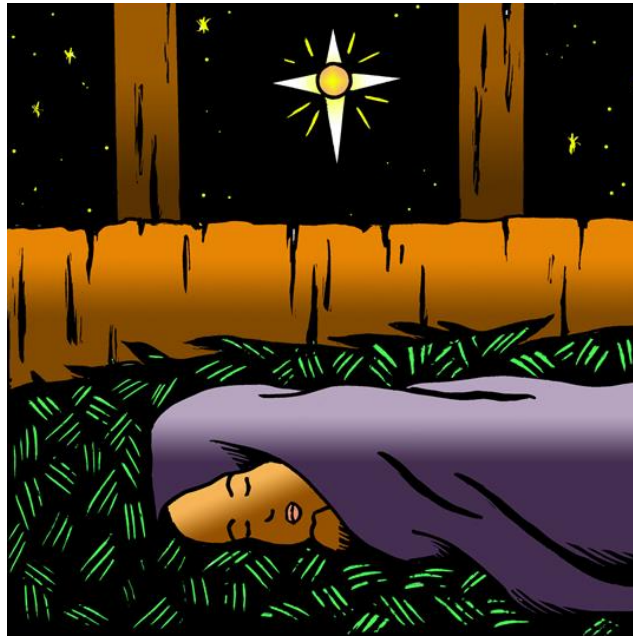
