

## The Spirit of Pentecost meets us in the Valley of Dry Bones

We've all been in the valley of dry bones. It is a place of danger. When we are in the valley of dry bones, we are in danger of giving up. We are in danger of making accommodations that will make us hate ourselves later. We are in danger of hopelessness. We are in danger of losing our faith.

Ezekiel stands in that valley of hopelessness, with the taste of dust on his lips and God says to him, "I want you to preach here. I want you to tell these old, dead, dried up and disintegrating bones that I am about to do a new thing with them.

Ezekiel stands and begins to preach. He says, "O dry bones, I have a ridiculous hope for you. You are going to live again. God is going to give you God's spirit... ruach...breath. God will not leave you for dead. God is going to restore you and your dreams." And that is when Ezekiel heard a faint rattle as the first bones heard his message. "O dry bones, you are going to live. Believe in what you cannot yet see." More rattling and soon in front of Ezekiel stood a multitude of hopeful, living people...restored to life...restored to community...restored to faith.

We celebrate Pentecost in May. There are some valleys of dry bones in our lives and in our world. God is saying, "Here. Be the church here. Preach to these dry bones. Believe in what you cannot yet see for the world is dying for us to believe that God is not done."

Like the burning fire of Pentecost opening the ears and hearts of the faithful, God's spirit breaks in most powerfully in the wilderness...in the dry places...in our self-imposed tombs...in pandemics...into our hopelessness.

Can these bones live? Yes! Believe that your discarded dreams can rise again.

## Facility and Grounds for May ....

Spring has sprung! Plants and trees are growing, putting out new leaves, flowers are blooming! Our Lent, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday were wonderful and brought out many new faces and some we hadn't seen for a while. (Hope they continue).

Now that Spring is in the air, it is time for LCOS to get busy with our To Do list! We have some important projects before hurricane season. First is the roof on Lu-

ther Hall, also the walkway, the Food Bank and Kitchen. No record has been found that states when the hall roof was last replaced, but one look at it and it is plain to see there is no 'grit' left on those shingles! The roof replacement for all will be about \$40,000. There is some walkway ceiling damage, rotted wood, and while several sheets of plywood are included, they will not know the actual need until the current shingles are removed. The roofing company can give us one year, interest free to pay it off, or a 5 to 10 year loan at 9.99% interest, or we get creative and come up with some ideas to raise the money. As Kristi reported, we have about \$25,000 we can put together.

Next comes our well pump. Not having the pump, a number of our hedges died, the rest are not looking too healthy. The Memorial Garden really depends on that sprinkler system. I know many have asked about planting flowers, but until there is water, we have to wait. The repair company was due out in April, so we may already have an answer. The company would not know what the condition of the pump is until they dug it out of the ground. Always a lot of 'wait and see' in our projects!

Looking ahead, probably next year's big project will be painting the church. The outside needs it, but we may have some inside painting as well. The projects never end.

## LCOS Treasurer's Report

#### March Review:

Church **income** in March was **\$21,278**, below our budget of \$63,767 and above last year's result of \$16,880.

- Member Giving for March was \$17,537, vs. our budget of \$17,100 and member giving last year of \$13,555. The timing of Easter lifted monthly member giving a bit, as expected.
- Our budgeted income for March included \$43,100 in designated funds, to be used for the installation of a new roof (Luther Hall, walkway, kitchen building). It now looks likely that the new roof will be installed in May 2024.
- We used \$500 in designated funds from the Mortgage Reduction fund during the month.
- Facilities/other income in March was \$3,242 vs. \$2,325 in the year-ago period.

Church expense was \$19,259 in March, vs. \$17,815 a year ago and our budget of \$63,916.

- Our budget for the month, as mentioned above, had included about \$43,000 for a new roof, which will likely happen later this Spring.
- Facilities expense for the month included \$3,066 in AC maintenance costs.
- All other expense categories were at or below expectations.

LCOS recorded **net income** of **\$2,019** in March.

## **Pentecost in the Bible – Acts of the Apostles**

We learn of Pentecost in the Christian tradition in Acts of the Apostles.



In the first chapter of Acts, Jesus alludes to sending the Holy Spirit onto his disciples:

While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the holy Spirit." (Acts 1:4-5)

The next chapter of Acts contains the fulfillment of Jesus's words. As the disciples were gathered in the upper room with others (a group of about 120 total), the Holy Spirit descended on them.

"And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." (Acts 2:2-4)
