PROPERTY MANAGER'S MESSAGE

The BIG question.....

How did Facility and Grounds spend its summer?

Well, Facility and Grounds was very busy! Our big project was the roof on Luther Hall, the walkway, the kitchen and foodbank. A big project with many surprises and changes. But, the project is finished and that should be good for at least the 10 to 15 years, or more.

That is just the outside of the Hall, but the inside had many things happening! The Hall is being leased on Friday/Saturdays, except the second Fri/Sat of each month, that weekend is reserved for anything we want to have.) The work is being done by the photographer and Carlos, from the Day Care. Thus far the stair case to the attic has been moved, the stage has been rebuilt, the floors have been cleaned and polished, the curtains are in along every wall, the chandeliers are in place, the restrooms have been redone, new chairs are being assembled. What was once our Craft Room has also been refurbished. When all is complete, the last item is a fresh coat of paint.

While most of us have watched the Hall transformation, few know the Train Club has been doing a major renovation! The once church storage building attached to the end of the Day Care has also had a clean out, clean up. The Train Club took on this project and cleared out years of accumulated stuff! (We never throw anything away!) Next they took out the wall between the storage room and a small space that had been used for storage by the school when it was using the space. The Train Club insulated the walls, put in new drywall, a ceiling, redid the floor, installed air conditioning, put in a conference table, added chairs from the Hall that are not needed and now they have a great meeting room.

All of these changes meant finding new places to put things we needed to keep, so the back room behind the stage was cleaned up and divided with the Korean church so they have their space and LCOS has theirs. The attic was also getting a good clean out, clean up but the staircase move sort of messed up the attic. That project will have to wait for much cooler weather! Also, added to the list of projects is the back room in the Sanctuary, which became our meeting room for many users.

In the end, we did stir up a lot of dust, make a lot of changes/upgrades and look forward to a great future here at LCOS!

Even the Memorial Garden got a facelift and there maybe some more items happening there, thanks to the future plans happening in the Hall.

July Review

July church income was \$19,646, above our budget of \$18,866 and below last year's result of \$18,923.

- Member Giving was \$15,223, above our budget of \$14,200 and giving last July of \$14,690.
- We used \$2,151 in Designated Funds, including \$2,000 from the Mortgage Reduction Fund and \$151 from the Roof Fund.
- Facilities/other income in July was \$2,272 vs. \$2,967 in the year-ago period.

Church expense was \$64,767 in July, vs. \$20,616 a year ago and our budget of \$23,220.

- Facilities expense in July included \$45,620 for the new roof on Luther Hall, the walkway, and the kitchen/foodbank building. Member gifts to the roof fund, as well as other designated funds, were deployed to meet this expense.
- Our budget for July had included a down payment for our combined insurance policies of \$5,047. Instead, we paid the \$3,687 down payment in June.
- Managing operations expense included an unplanned \$700 for improvements to our church website, https://www.lcostampa.org, as we gear up for this year's golf tournament. Interested golfers, donors, and sponsors can now register and pay online.
- Other expense categories were generally in line or below expectations.

LCOS recorded a net loss of (\$45,121) in July.

For the year to date, we have a loss of \$646. A loss is not generally good news, but I'm grateful that we were able to digest the cost of such a major capital improvement. I am confident that we can recover, and continue to rebuild our reserves, in the second half of 2024.
