Zapped for the New Year

Some years ago I read a wonderful management book by

WORLD

William Byham called *Zapp!, the Lightening of Empowerment*. Though it was written for managers in the business world, I have always thought that Byham had a lot to share with the Church. *Zapp* is the empowerment of people through the giving of power. *Sapp*, on the other hand, is the taking of that same power. When you have been *Sapped*, says Byham, you feel like your contributions really don't count, you have little or no control over your work, and you must be careful to keep your mouth shut. When you are *Zapped*, you feel like your count for something, your job counts, people want to know what you think.

A New Year always challenges me to examine carefully my life and my work and my faith. It is a wonderful time to consider tossing out those concerns and thoughts that do nothing but *Sapp* me of my spiritual, emotional and physical strength. A New Year is a time to be *Zapped* by God's Spirit, not *Sapped* by the sins of the past.

I wonder whether some of our challenges at Lutheran Church of Our Saviour are the result of our failure to be open to accept the Holy Spirit's *"Zapp!"* The characteristic of healthy Christians who have been *Zapped* by the Spirit are similar to those Byham describes in the healthy business. We are saved from any small-minded notions of what God has done for us. Because of God's grace, we are empowered to maintain and enhance self-esteem; listen and respond with empathy; share thoughts and feelings; and ask for help and encourage involvement and new ideas.

As God's people "*Zapped* by the Spirit," we stand at the beginning of a new year with the assurance that the "Sapping" can stop! My New Year's prayer is that each of us are open to the Holy Spirit's *Zapp* and that we practice *Zapping* each other in 2025! By the power of the Spirit, we will notice that God has already provided us everything we need for success.

- Opening prayer at 11:08am.
- In the financial report, Kristi shared that the cost to repair the roof on the day care building was \$18,000 and has been paid in full. Discussion was held regarding memorial funds as well as additional repairs to our facilities that may be needed in the future.
- Pastor's Report: Pastor shared that there continue to be more hospital visits. He also discussed the special worship service that is now scheduled for November 10th. In addition, he shared information about the teams that have been formed – specifically communications. Karen Urban is working with Deacon Steve on our regular newsletter.
- Reports were shared regarding the Kaye Prox Food Bank, Golf Tournament and Facilities and Grounds.
- There was no new business.
- Closing prayer at 11:58am.

LCOS Council Meeting Summary – November 17, 2024

- Opening prayer at 11:02am.
- The financial report showed a net loss of \$580 in October mostly attributed to the storms that we weathered through. Annual staff raises were discussed.
- In the pastor's report, Pastor Steve shared updates regarding our newsletter team, advent services and new members.
- Reports were shared and discussed regarding the Kaye Prox Food Bank and Facilities and Grounds.
- Old Business featured a report on the Golf Tournament, which was very successful.
- New Business focused on a discussion of outgoing council members, suggestions for new council members and the congregational meeting scheduled for December 15.
- Closing prayer at 12:02pm.

Treasurer REPORT

November Review:

November church **income** was **\$30,994**, below our budget of \$35,067 and slightly ahead of last year's result of \$30,339.

- Member Giving was \$14,212, below the budget of \$17,000 and ahead of November 2023 giving of \$12,733.
- We used no Designated Funds during the month and recorded Golf Fun(d)Raiser revenue of \$13,281.
- Facilities/other income in November was \$3,502 vs. \$2,392 in the year-ago period.

Church **expense** was **\$23,412** in November, vs. \$22,271 a year ago and our budget of \$26,844.

- Golf Fun(d)Raiser expense was \$3,491, for a tournament net profit of \$9,790.
- A total of \$1,979 of the Golf Fun(d)Raiser net proceeds was donated to the Kaye Prox Food Bank. This amount was recorded as a Mission Expense for the month of November.
- Other expense categories were generally in line with expectations for the month.

LCOS recorded a **net gain** of **\$7,582** in November.

Musings:



The Kaye Prox Food Bank received a couple of notable donations during the month of November: First, the Watson family presented a generous gift in the name of Connie Watson. We are touched and thankful for this kind gesture. Second, our appreciation to the entire team of the Golf Fun(d) Raiser; the food bank was blessed to receive a donation of \$1,979 from the tournament proceeds.

All of these funds will be used toward the installation of new flooring in the food bank building, beginning Friday December 13th. The current tiles were lifting in several places and cracking in others, with large sections of the floor affected.

Also in November, the Food Bank served 300 families with turkeys/chickens and meal kits (potatoes, gravy, stuffing mix, canned vegetables, etc.) during the week preceding Thanksgiving. We really appreciate each of the generous donations (cash, food items) we received in support of our Thanksgiving drive. J J

Over the Thanksgiving weekend, Grace Lutheran Church conducted a food drive at their local Publix. Much of the food they collected was donated to Kaye Prox Food Bank, over 1,600 pounds – what a blessing!! We are so grateful to Dave Davies and all of the other members of Grace Lutheran who participated in the food drive.

In general, we continue to serve 300 families per week, with distributions on Mondays and Wednesdays at 12:30 pm, and a Friday distribution at 2:30 pm. Donations from church and community members support this mission, along with high-volume food donations from Feeding Tampa Bay and local retailers.

The food bank is 100% powered by volunteers from this church and from the surrounding community. They are a wonderful team, and we are always ready to welcome a new volunteer! A holiday lunch for food bank volunteers is planned for Tuesday, December 17th in Luther Hall.



Advent Thursday Series Submitted by Deacon Steve Smeach

On the three Thursdays of Advent (December 6, 13, and 20) at 11:30, Pr Steve and Deacon Steve facilitated a small group discussion of *"Heaven and Earth"*, a DVD authored by Reverend Will Willimon, a Methodist pastor and dean of the Duke University School of Divinity.

IFor Willimon, Advent is not merely a season of quiet preparation; it is a disruptive event where God intervenes in history to overturn human expectations and establish divine priorities. His apocalyptic vision challenges the status quo.

The three sessions covered:

1. Meanwhile -a discussion of Jesus apocalyptic sermon in Mark 13, daring us to consider how and why God wants us to shake up the world, like he did in bringing Christ into the world.

2. Surprised -a discussion of how Jon the Baptizer's message of repentance and

3. Rejoice -the story of Gabriel's announcement to the Virgin Mary that she would divinely conceive a son to be called Jesus and Mary's joyful song of praise, The Magnificat.

Advent Sundays: Lighting the Advent Wreath


During each of the four Sundays of Advent, we ask member families to light our Advent Wreath.


